BEST PRACTICES FOR A SUCCESSFUL EXPO LIVE MEETING ON ZOOM



Settings and Safety Measures

For exhibitors that wish to host video or live content during the Let's Grow STEAMx (LGSx) Youth College and Career Expo on October 14, 2021. This is entirely optional and in addition to the Q&A feature select booths (Cultivator Level and above) will have for text format questions.

- Decide on the time and content for your meeting. Some options might include, but not limited to:
 - > Tours of facilities, offices or worksites
 - > Moderated panel discussions
 - > Demonstrations of skills or tools
- Set up your meeting. We strongly suggest using Zoom, as students are most familiar with this platform and it does not require students to download anything or create accounts to participate.
 - If you do not have an account with Zoom, you may create a free account for group meetings. Note that free accounts will be limited to 40 minutes and <100 participants.</p>
- **Plan for safety:** If you host a live talk as part of the Expo, we require that you have at least two adult representatives from your organization present. This is aligned with best practices around volunteer and student safety. No 1-on-1 interactions with students are permitted; thank you for understanding.
- Share your meeting within your booth. Use the "Content Links" in the Booth Setup to create a link to your meeting invite right from your booth. Also, add the times and content in the "Booth Description" so students can see what you plan to offer and when.
 - For example: "October 14, 2-2:30 PM Join us for a live chat and demonstration of welding tools and tips to get started in a career in manufacturing!"
- Let LGSx know. Share your talk topic and times with LGSx by email (yccexpo@letsgrowsteam.org) so we can help promote it. Please inform LGSx of your plan to host a Zoom meeting in your booth no later than Monday, August 16th.
- Safety and security settings for your session.
 - > Create a Waiting Room. A "Waiting Room" allows you to admit students when you're ready. This setting may be adjusted within your account before the meeting.
 - 1. Login to your account.
 - 2. Under "Personal", click "Settings"
 - 3. Select "Security" in the side menu, then toggle on "Enable Waiting Room"

Note: The host or co-host will need to "admit" students into the talk. Assume all attendees are students or educators. If an account looks suspicious, use your best judgment for admittance.

• Plan to moderate the chat. Use the settings within Zoom to ensure that only messages are sent directly to the host and not posted publicly. This is intended to avoid any potential disparaging or inappropriate content or behavior.

This setting must be adjusted within your account ahead of time:

- 1. Before starting the meeting, login to your account.
- 2. Under "Personal", click "Settings".
- 3. Select "In Meeting (Basic)" in the side menu, then toggle off "Chat"

Students' comments will go directly to the host and can be answered live.

- Use additional security features. Once in the meeting, we advise that you adjust the following security features from the "Security" Menu.
 - > Enable the Waiting Room checked/enabled
 - > Share Screen unchecked/disabled
 - > Rename Themselves unchecked/disabled
 - Unmute Themselves checked/enabled (depending your desired format)
- **Record the session.** Recording the session to the cloud will allow your meeting link to become on-demand for students accessing the event later.
 - > Make sure the host is in active speaker view. Click the option to Record.
